

A Few Kinds of Wrong Book Club Questions for Discussion

1. What does the title, *A Few Kinds of Wrong*, mean to you?
2. Jennifer Collins is a woman in a non-traditional job for women. How do you think that affects her?
3. What experience do you have with women in non-traditional jobs?
4. Some people find Jennifer a frustrating character? Did you? Why or why not?
5. Do you think Jennifer is a strong person or a weak one? Explain why.
6. Jennifer embraces her grandmother's dementia as a coping mechanism. How did this make you feel about Jennifer?
7. Who was a character that stood out to you the most and why?
8. How do you feel about the character of Jamie? How did your opinion of him change over the course of the book?
9. Do you think that one person influenced Jennifer the most in her life and if so, who was this person and why do you think his/her influence was most felt?
10. If you could have dinner with one of the characters—alive or dead—which one would it be and why?
11. There are two revelations in the book about Jennifer's mother—her new relationship and the truth about why her mother never called Jennifer when she left Jennifer's father. How do each of these make you feel about Jennifer's mother, Grace? How does Jennifer's reaction to these revelations make you feel about Jennifer?
12. How do you think Jennifer's view of death changed throughout the book, or did it? How do you relate to those views?
13. In what ways is memory a central theme of this book?
14. Do you think that the relationship between Jamie and Jennifer is a healthy one by the end of the book? Why or why not?
15. Tina Chaulk has said that she thinks this book is, at its heart, a love story, concerned with many different kinds of love. What kinds of love do you think she is talking about?
16. At the end of the book, what do you think Jamie's calloused hands meant to Jennifer?
17. Did you find the ending satisfying? Why or why not?
